Annual Sustainable Growth Strategy (ASGS)

What it means: **European Commission**

(EC) decides the EU's priorities for 2021, based on:

- > the four pillars of the European Green Deal (green, digital, fairness, economic).
- > the Recovery and Resilience Facility (emergency fund for Covid-19 and aftermath).
- ★ Input statement (before the ASGS is released).

EU lobbying actions

- * Assessment of the ASGS once out.
- ★ Input to the European Parliament (EP) report on the ASGS.
- ★ Joint lobbying with Brussels partners.

National Recovery and Resilience Plans (NRRPs)

What it means:

Member states draft their NRRPs, which describe proposed reforms and investments for each country. These are based on a Guidance and template prepared by the EC. Governments may organise public consultations and other stakeholder engagement activities.

- ★ Lobby the EC to put pressure on Governments to carry out stakeholder consultations.

Submission of National Recovery and Resilience Plans (NRRPs)

Member states submit their final NRRPs to the EC, who will make them public. Some countries may do so slightly earlier or later.

Council Implementing Decisions (proposal)

What it means:

Member states will submit the NRRPs at different times. The EC will assess each Plan within two months of receiving it, and it will propose draft Council Implementing Decisions (evaluating the Plans), accompanied by a Staff Working Document (explaining the reasoning behind the evaluation). The assessment procedure is described in the Recovery and Resilience Facility Regulation.
